Three Captains were standing together in the street, when a shell was heard coming over. Two muched one way and Capt. McKensie the other. The shell caught him and blem both his logs off, lacerating his body terribly at the same time. I heard those particulars soon afterwards. I do not know where he was buried. It dol. I know Copt. McLonnie well he joined us at Modekir Egypt and was killed at about 11.30 p.m. in front of the Augroges Esteminst. Erquinghes. He was atruck by a shell in the lags which severed his left leg and out him about very hedly. Death was instantaneous. He had just made his round of the billets and was proceeding to his own. He was about 5 ft 5 or 6 and was a very dapper little Testehman. He had only just returned from the Gen Tehool. He was buried in the Churchyard of Erquinghes and the boys erected a cross on his grave with his ness on it and the australian badge. I have seen the grave.
